"The Reason for the Season"

Every year, around this time, we begin to enjoy the sights and sounds of the Holiday season. Decorations and lights begin to adorn houses and yards. Our prayer life starts to include canons of supplication for parking spots at the mall! Radio stations begin to play some version of "Jingle Bells" five to ten times an hour. Christmas is indeed coming, and we spend much of our time shopping, traveling, cooking, and decorating for the big day! It feels as if every year Christmas becomes more commercialized and less celebrated. Every year we are tempted to lose the real reason for the season. But is there anything wrong with shopping and buying presents for our loved ones? Is there anything wrong with cooking and decorating for Christmas? Of course not! - Just as long as we remember to keep Christ at the center of all our holiday festivities. The



following are a few practical ideas to help ensure that the Birth According to the Flesh of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ remains the focal point of our Christmas Season.

Shopping and buying presents is an integral part of celebrating Christmas. Indeed, we offer gifts to family and friends to remind us of the greatest gift that we receive - the gift of our salvation through the Birth of Christ. This does not mean that we should not set limits to our Christmas spending. We can express our love for family and friends in simple and humble ways, which need not max-out our credit cards. We should also remember that it is okay to give religious gifts to celebrate a religious holiday! We do not have to give *only* religious gifts, but it's also okay if we sneak in an icon or bible without anyone noticing.

It is also helpful to remember that as we are celebrating a religious holiday, that there is in fact a Fast in preparation of the Feast. There is a forty-day fast for Christmas beginning on November 15th. Christmas is a Feastday of the Church – we should be fasting to prepare ourselves to properly celebrate the Feast! While you're thinking about how to prepare your Christmas ham, or turkey or prime rib, it's okay to be cooking lentils, or fasolia, or briami! Remember to fast for the Feast!

It is commonly said that, "Christmas is for kids"; and although Christ's Birth is for all mankind, there is an innocent warmth to the season that can only be captured in the wideeyed gaze of a small child. Christmas *is* for kids, and we should help ensure that kids can also understand what Christmas is. As you set up your little nativity set, read the story of Christ's birth and discuss it as a family. As you nail up your stockings to the fireplace, read the life of Saint Nicholas the Wonderworker, and Saint Basil the Great to your children and grandchildren. As you decorate your Christmas Tree, read the story of Adam and Eve, and discuss how the "Tree of Life" is now given to us through the Birth of our Savior.

Christmas is indeed a wonderful and powerful time of year. The temptation to commercialize rather than celebrate the holiday will always be with us, and it may even increase as society becomes more pluralistic and agnostic. However, as long as we focus our family on the Birth of Christ, and celebrate the Feast of His Nativity we can avoid the snares of over-commercialism and emerge empowered by His Birth.

ST. DEMETRIOS ICONOGRAPHY PROJECT THIS MONTH!



Since some families in our community have shown an interest in continuing with the iconography program of our Church, we are now offering our faithful stewards and friends an opportunity to donate toward the completion of the next phase of our iconography.

On December 5th we will be blessed to have our iconographer Andromache Voutsinas with us to complete and install the next phase of our iconography.

This next phase will complete iconography in two separate areas of our church: the vertical arch above and around the Platytera, and the half-circle above the carved wooden doors in the Narthex. The arch above and surrounding the Platytera will consist of the icons of Pentecost and Annunciation; which have already been donated by one of our generous Stewards (pictured below to the right).

The half circle above the carved wooden doors in the Narthex will contain a beautiful icon of our Patron Saint Demetrios enthroned with his two students on either side: St. Nestor and St. Lupo (icon pictured above).

Since the icons of Pentecost and Annunciation are already donated, we are not featuring information for sponsorships about them in our iconography project. However, all of our faithful stewards and friends have an opportunity to participate in our iconography project by becoming a Benefactor, Sponsor, or Contributor of our icon of St. Demetrios with Sts. Nestor and Lupo.

All donations can be made over a twoyear period. The three levels of donations are: Benefactor - \$5000, Sponsor - \$2500, and Contributor - \$1000. Everyone who participates will have their names listed on the donor recognition display, which will be placed in the Narthex. The three levels of donations will be



specified by the size and placement of the donor recognition.

Our 2017 Proposed Budget was approved at our General Parish Assembly in November. Please note the highlighted numbers above in yellow:

- Our mortgage (\$387,300) represents about 58% of our total expenses.

- Our Stewardship (\$350,000) represents about 56% of our total income.

We are currently anticipating a deficit for 2017 of \$43,554!

This is why we need all our faithful Saint Demetrios members to increase their stewardship as much as possible in 2017.

We need everyone to make their 2017 Stewardship Commitment as soon as they can.

We also need as many families as possible to consider taking advantage of Direct Debit, to help the Church's cash flow on a monthly basis.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Several weeks ago, at our annual General Assembly meeting, the community approved the 2017 budget. As a member of St. Demetrios, you should be aware of where your stewardship dollars are being spent. Our expense budget for next year is \$669,554. That is a huge burden for our small community. 58% of this, \$387,300 is for the mortgage expense to the bank alone. The rest is what is needed to keep our doors open. Everyone knows very well that we have been scrimping and scraping for many years and are always looking for ways to cut down on our expenses. But there is a point where you can cut no more. In past years, we have estimated our income from our fundraising sources but whatever the difference has been, we have plugged into our stewardship goal to come up with a balanced budget. Unfortunately, we have never been able to meet that goal and it doesn't really make sense to do that when we know that is not where the income is going to come from. So that leaves us this year with a \$40,000 deficit. This past year, we were very fortunate and had several one time sources of income that allowed us to close our gap. But we are going to be facing challenges this year if we do not find a way to fund that deficit. In addition to your obligation to be interested in the expenses of your church, it is also your obligation to be helping to generate additional income for the church. There are so many opportunities to help bring outside income to the church other than through stewardship. We have three food festivals per year, we have a beautiful hall that can be rented for events, we have other fundraising events planned. Helping to make these events successful can make a big difference. Imagine if each family found one neighbor or friend to rent our hall, we would be booked solid for several years. Soon you will be hearing about the fundraiser that we are planning for April. We will be asking you to help sell tickets. It will be an easy task and if everyone pitches in, we can easily cover our deficit. But sadly, what usually happens is that most people just expect someone else to do the work, and then they complain when we come back to the community and ask for more money to pay our bills. Help prove me wrong for the coming year. Thank you, Sonia **Pylarinos**
