## Getting Ready for Great Lent

In Her wisdom, the Orthodox Church, does not allow us to abruptly enter the fast of Great and Holy Lent. Great Lent is, at the same time, both a journey and a battle. It is the journey of every Christian toward the Resurrection of our Lord, and it is also the "good fight" that every one of us wages against sin and temptation. Since journeys and battles require preparation to be successful, our Church calendar allows us several weeks to gird ourselves for battle, and pack necessary provisions for our spiritual excursion toward Golgotha. The weeks of preparation, with their corresponding themes, are as follows:

The first Sunday of preparation is that of The Publican and The Pharisee. The major theme for this Sunday, and consequently for this week, is that of humility. In *The Ladder of Divine Ascent* Saint John Climacus describes humility in this fashion: "Humility is constant forgetfulness of one's achievements. It is the admission that in all the world one is the least important and is also the greatest sinner. It is the mind's awareness that one is weak and helpless. Just as birds fear the sight of a hawk, those who practice humility fear the sound of an argument. A man truly humble within himself will never find his tongue betraying him. What is not in the treasury cannot be brought out through the door."

The second Sunday of preparation for Great Lent is The Prodigal Son. The major theme for this Sunday is that of repentance and confession. In *The Spiritual Life* Saint Theophan the Recluse discusses the importance of repentance and confession: "Why, then, do you write that you are afraid to go to confession? Many people have such a fear, but why you? Allow me to clear up the matter for you. The (father) confessor is merely the witness, the Lord accepts the sins. It is He who commands the confessor to give absolution to the person who confesses. It is the Lord who is merciful. He is just waiting for a person to confess his sins, and as soon as he does, He immediately forgives him. What is there to fear from such a Lord? Go to the Lord calmly, but with a contrite heart; go as the prodigal son went to his father in the parable. The father of the returning son did not rebuke him or scold him; rather, he reached out to embrace and kiss him. The same thing is waiting for you. The arms of the Lord are already reaching out toward you."

The third Sunday of preparation for Great Lent is Judgment Sunday (also Meatfare Sunday). The major theme of this Sunday is that of almsgiving or charity. Saint John Chrysostom reflects on "almsgiving" or giving to the poor when he states: "Do you see that the failure to give alms is enough to cast a person into hell-fire? For where will he avail who does not give alms? Do you fast every day? So also did those foolish virgins, but it availed them nothing. Do you pray? So did they. What of it? Prayer without almsgiving is unfruitful." Saint Basil also speaks of almsgiving when he writes: "He who takes another's clothing is called a thief, but he who fails to clothe the naked, if he could, deserves the very same name. The grain in your barns belongs to the hungry. The coat in your closet belongs to the naked. The shoes rotting in your basement belong to the barefoot. The silver hidden in boxes belongs to the needy. You sin against all those whom you are able to help, but fail to do so."

The last Sunday of preparation before Great and Holy Lent is the Sunday of Forgiveness (also Cheesefare Sunday). The theme of this day is, of course, forgiveness. Before we enter the Lenten Fast, we are reminded that there can be no true fast, no genuine repentance, no reconciliation with God, unless we are at the same time reconciled with one another. *A fast without mutual love is the fast of demons*. We do not travel the road of Great Lent as isolated individuals but as members of a family. Our asceticism and fasting should not separate us from each other, but draw us even closer together.

# How to Read the Bible






